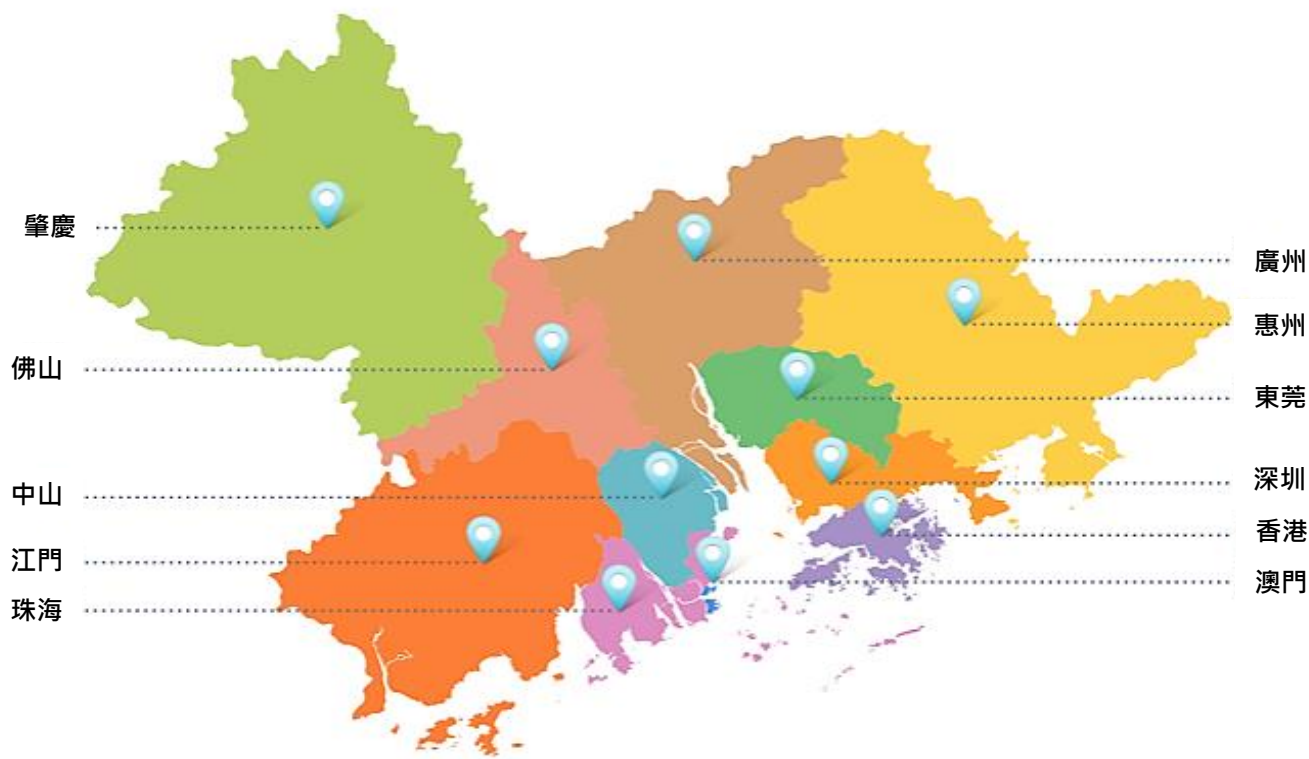

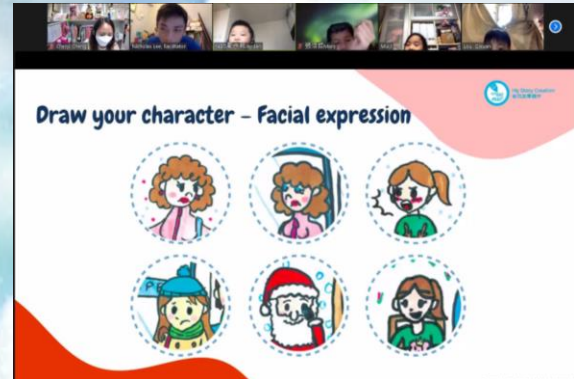
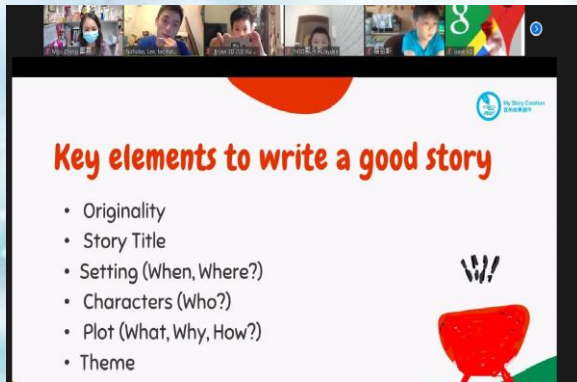
Halloween Celebration

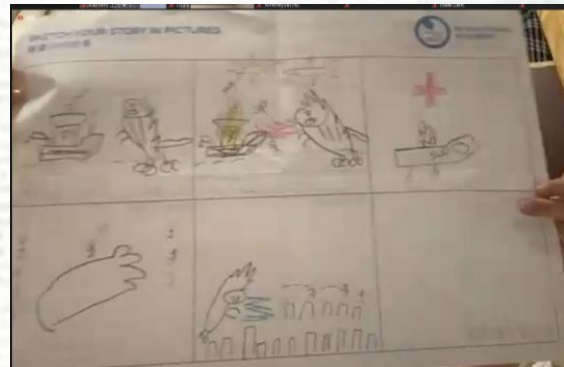


Kids4Kids My Story Creation Workshop

To nurture students' interest and ability in creative writing and illustration, our school joined Kids4Kids My Story Creation Program in which students participated in workshops about creative writing and illustration.



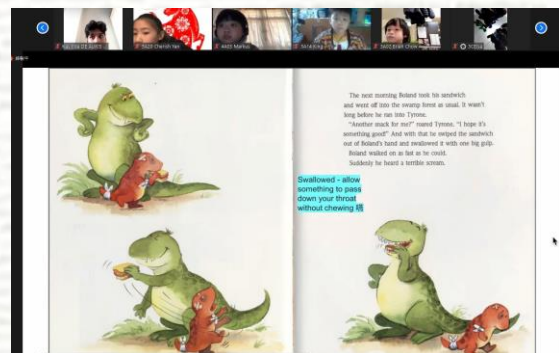
Students learn the skills to write a good story and to draw illustration.

Bizarre Festivals From Around the World

A festival is a day or period of celebration. One participates in the celebration to enjoy it and spend time with friends and family.

The globe is surrounded by bizarre festivals. From throwing tomatoes or oranges at each other to going in complete silence are some examples of unusual, bizarre festivals.

La Tomatina, Spain

La Tomatina is celebrated on the last Wednesday of August each year in Bunol, Spain. It is known as *World's Largest Food Fight* because thousands of people gather to throw more than one hundred metric tons of over-ripe tomatoes at one another.



No one is certain about the origin of this festival. However, a possible theory is that angry townspeople started throwing tomatoes at the city councilmen during a town celebration. Well, irrespective of the origin, people enjoyed this so much that it has become a yearly event.

This festival is sure to leave a stain and a splat; therefore, make sure you put on comfortable shoes and wear clothes that you don't intend to wear again!

Battle of Oranges, Italy

The **Battle of the Oranges**, a unique festival, occurs in the city of Ivrea, Italy around February or March. It is said to be the largest food fight in Italy because it includes a tradition of throwing oranges between teams. It is said that the origin of this festival dates back to olden days and is said to honour the day the people were liberated from the harsh rule of an evil man.



The festival is celebrated for three days. The streets are filled with squashed oranges which fill the air with a citrus aroma. If you're in Ivrea, Italy at the time of this festival, don't be surprised if you see people throwing oranges at one another!

It is recommended that you wear comfortable shoes so that you don't slip while walking through the oranges. Non-participants wear red hats which denote that you are a spectator and should be treated as one! Nevertheless, if you're in the square, it is possible that you may get hit by oranges, so do watch out!

Day of Silence, Indonesia

The Day of Silence, known as *Nyepi*, takes place in the city of Bali in Indonesia. It is the traditional new year according to the Balinese Saka Calendar.

The people welcome the new year with peace and calmness. It means that the entire city shuts down for a period of 24 hours, including the airport! Nyepi is observed from 6 a.m. until 6 a.m. the next morning. It is a day for self-reflection. The main restrictions include no lighting fires (indoor lights are expected to be dimmed), no travelling, no working, or entertainment. Some locals even choose to fast! Although the visitors are not expected to fast, they are expected to take this event seriously. Officials patrol the streets to ensure there is no violation.



On the day after Nyepi, social activity resumes and locals perform certain religious rituals together.

If you're in Bali around Nyepi, make sure you're quiet! Shhh!!

Hello all,

People often ask me how long I have been a teacher and to give you some indication, I qualified to teach English back in 2013 when I still lived in the UK. But how I arrived at that point crosses industries and continents and is one I'd like to share with you.

As a student I excelled in creative subjects. I was good at Technology, English Literature, History and Photography. When I was 16 years old I thought I would follow what many of my family members had become and be an engineer so I enrolled in college to study engineering.

所有因敲擊而發聲的樂器，皆可視為敲擊樂器。

敲擊樂器雖然很少成為主奏樂器，但因有加強樂曲氣氛的功效，所以在管弦樂團中佔一席位。敲擊樂器可分為有固定音高與無固定音高兩類。

具有音高又稱為有調敲擊樂器，此類敲擊樂器的音高富於變化，可演奏旋律，包含木琴、馬林巴琴、管鐘、鋼片琴、震音鐵琴、鐘琴、定音鼓等。
